Type of action	Nationwide school competition for global learning and education for sustainable development (ESD).

Short description of the initiatives	The school competition invites students across Germany to creatively engage with global development issues and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Taking place every two years, the competition promotes global learning in schools by encouraging classes and project groups to develop entries on topics such as climate justice, global inequality, peace, and solidarity. It is accompanied by the youth music contest “Dein Song für EINE WELT!”
Activities and methods implemented	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Project-based learning: Students work on interdisciplinary and creative entries (posters, films, digital content, exhibitions, etc.). The competition is designed to be easily embedded in regular classroom teaching</li> <li>• Participation formats: Individual, group, or class-wide projects; cooperation with external partners encouraged</li> <li>• Song Contest: The complementary contest “Dein Song für EINE WELT!” allows young people to express global issues through music</li> </ul>
Key Success Factors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wide reach and accessibility: Open to all school types and age groups</li> <li>• Creative freedom: Broad range of project formats encourages diverse student talents</li> <li>• Strong institutional backing: Endorsed by the German Federal President and funded by the BMZ</li> <li>• Long-term visibility: Winning entries are published and showcased</li> <li>• Accompanying materials and teacher support: Enables quality and continuity in education for sustainable development</li> </ul>
